### Title: One Day Workshop on “Future Scaping New Criminal Law's: Innovations and Reforms”

Date: 1st July, 2024

#### EVENT BRIEF

The Indian Home Ministry in 2024 announced the enactment of three new criminal laws, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023, effective July 1, 2024.

These bills repeal the British-era Indian Penal Code, the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act, respectively. This workshop provides an idea about developing laws and policies that prioritize the needs and rights of victims, ensuring they have a voice in the justice process and access to necessary support services.

The students gained insights upon the new laws which overhaul the Indian criminal justice system, which aim to revamp and replace the colonial laws, by considering implementation of justice through a victim centric approach, increasing focus on national security and introducing digital/electronic evidence reviews, making them priorities of these laws.



**Legal Interpretation:**

- The high number of dismissed cases may reflect issues in preliminary screening or insufficient evidence.
- Convictions being lower than dismissals suggests a need to strengthen prosecution quality.

**Policy Recommendations:**

- Implement pre-trial review mechanisms to reduce weak case filings.
- Enhance public prosecution capacity through training and resources.
- Pursue better documentation and investigation at the police level to reduce acquittals.


### “Tree Plantation Drive” On Occasion of Republic Day

### Poverty and Education in India: Bridging the Gap for Equal Access

India, the world's largest democracy with a population exceeding 1.3 billion, continues to face significant challenges in ensuring equal access to education. Despite commendable economic progress over recent decades, 22% of the population still lives below the poverty line, and 30% of children drop out of school by age 14. The link between poverty and educational exclusion is undeniable and demands urgent attention.

Education is widely acknowledged as a powerful tool to break the cycle of poverty. However, in India, children from poor households face multiple barriers that prevent them from accessing and completing quality education. These barriers are not merely financial, they are structural, social, psychological, and geographical in nature.

#### Barriers to Education

Economic barriers include tuition fees, costs for uniforms, books, and transportation, making education unaffordable for many. Opportunity costs, such as sending children to work rather than to school, further limit educational attainment.

Social and cultural barriers, such as caste discrimination, gender bias, early marriage, and social stigma, disproportionately affect girls and marginalized communities. Psychological barriers, including stress, low self-esteem, and lack of motivation, often stemmed from chronic poverty and social exclusion. Furthermore, environmental and infrastructural challenges, including inadequate school buildings, unsafe environments, and long distances to schools, compound these difficulties.

Technological barriers, which became particularly visible during the COVID-19 pandemic, have also widened the digital divide, excluding millions of students from online learning due to lack of access to devices and the internet.

#### Disparities in Literacy and Enrollment

The literacy rate in India as of 2021 is 77.7%, with male literacy at 84.7% and female literacy at 70.3%. States like Kerala lead with a literacy rate of 96.2%, while Andhra Pradesh trails behind at 66.4%. The rural-urban divide remains stark, with rural literacy at 73.5% compared to 87.7% in urban areas. These disparities reflect the uneven access to education that continues to define India's social fabric.

#### Government and Policy Initiatives

Several initiatives have been launched to address these challenges. The Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009 mandates free and compulsory education for children aged 6–14. Programs like Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, and platforms like the National Scholarship Portal aim to support underprivileged students.

### Poverty and Education in India: Bridging the Gap for Equal Access

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 sets ambitious goals, including achieving 100% gross enrollment by 2030, strengthening infrastructure, and integrating vocational training. Initiatives like Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao and Swayam have also contributed to improving access and reducing dropout rates, especially among girls and disadvantaged communities.

India's adoption of the Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) has allowed policymakers to understand poverty beyond income factoring in health, education, and living standards to create more targeted interventions. According to the 2023 MPI Progress Review, poverty in India is steadily declining, but educational deprivation remains a significant component.

#### The Way Forward

Despite ongoing efforts, challenges persist, particularly in the aftermath of the pandemic, which widened the learning gaps and digital inequalities. To truly ensure equal access to education, India must:

- Strengthen rural and remote school infrastructure
- Invest in teacher training and recruitment
- Expand scholarships and conditional cash transfer programs
- Promote inclusive education for girls, children with disabilities, and minorities
- Bridge the digital divide with device and internet access
- Encourage community participation and awareness programs
